2005 SPORTS INJURY FUNDING

One off grants of up to \$2,000 are available to eligible sports clubs to purchase sports injury prevention equipment and/or first aid training. Funds approved by VicHealth may not cover the full costs requested. Any additional funding will need to be met by your club. Applicants must be;

- Victorian based
- Not-for-profit
- An incorporated body
- Have satisfactorily acquitted any previous grants from VicHealth

The Program aims to improve the safety of sporting environments and reduce the likelihood of injury while promoting healthy participation.

DROUGHT RECOVERY FUND 2005- GUIDELINES

Objectives

The Drought Recovery Program has been established to equitably distribute the \$400,000 made available to Council under the State Government Rural Community Infrastructure Development Grants Program for drought-affected communities in North-West Victoria.

Eligible Projects

The Program is targeted at community infrastructure projects which have a social benefit, and will consist of grants for projects such as maintaining sporting and community facilities, streetscape works and upgrading public infrastructure. Applicants must be able to demonstrate the social benefit of each project proposed for funding, and how they relate to lessening the effects of the adverse climatic conditions of recent years.

Level of Assistance

Projects will be funded up to 100% of the cost, to a maximum of \$50,000 per project. Projects which include some local contributions (cash and/or in-kind) will be viewed favourably, but is not essential.

Conditions
