DAMAGE TO PROPERTY IN PUBLIC PLACES

Damage to property in public places is increasing in Warracknabeal according to Shire Local Laws Officer, Greg Wilson. Examples of this is graffiti at the Lions Park, vandalism in the Skate Park/Stadium area including smashing of empty beer bottles. Under Councils Local Law No5 Sec 302 (i) a&b the consumption of alcohol is prohibited in areas such as the Skate Park and people found doing this will be given an on the spot fine of \$100. General damage to public property including the removal of 40km/hr speed sign in Anderson Street attracts a fine of \$100 under section 303(b) of Local Law No5.

Over last weekend 2-4 December, Sgt Bill Alford from Warracknabeal Police Station said that the police received 9 reports of damage to property and that he is asking anyone who has witnessed any of this damage or has information to notify Police.
