SRHC gave a presentation on their strategic direction for bringing executive rail travel to the standard gauge network across the western half of the state including the Yarriambiack Shire.

Strategy ties in with Grampians Tourism, leveraging off Grampians and moving into regions surrounding Grampians. SRHC are looking to collaborate collectively with all shires to provide multi-day travel packages to tourists from Melbourne, Geelong and the Bellarine Peninsula, capitalising on the many tourism assets.

There are great opportunities within the Yarriambiack Shire including the Silo Art Trail, horse racing and many others.

Finding a solution to the short-term accommodation issue that brining up to 250 visitors at once will bring.

8) Tourism Strategy Consultation

Draft strategy to be considered by Council in last week of April.

Draft 2023-27 vision is "To increasingly build a national reputation for Yarriambiack's visitor experiences assisted by welcoming communities, service oriented businesses and regional collaborators To achieve this vision, Yarriambiack Shire Council will facilitate and support tourism initiatives which:

- Formalise the establishment of new tourism products.
- Add value to Yarriambiack's existing visitor experiences.
- Involve regional cooperation.
- Increase the economic and social yield from tourism.
- Expand the market segments who are attracted to Yarriambiack's towns and attractions.

Five themes of 2023-27 Tourism Strategy and spoke to them

- Theme 1: Evolving tourist friendly towns.
- Theme 2: Strengthening existing attractions.
- Theme 3: Formalising the next wave of Yarriambiack visitor experiences
- Theme 4: A proactive Council
- Theme 5: "Sharing in a bigger visitor economy": Regional tourism collaboration.

Ideas suggested: beers with local labelling to supplement Wimmera Harvest Fare project. Gift boxes may also be a good idea, especially for gifts. Visitor information centres will have empty baskets to take around to gather souvenirs.
