RE: Proposed Road Naming – Renaming of Unnamed Lane 04, Beulah to “Isbel Lane”

Yarriambiack Shire Council, as the naming authority, is proposing to formally name an existing unnamed laneway known locally as Unnamed Laneway 04 in Beulah to Isbel Lane.

Location and Extent:

The laneway proposed to be named is located within the township of Beulah, extending east–west between Gladstone Street and Phillips Street. A location map showing the extent of the proposed road naming is shown below.

Reason for the Naming:

The naming proposal seeks to provide an official name to the currently unnamed laneway to improve property addressing, emergency service response, and mail delivery efficiency. The name *Isbel Lane* has been chosen to recognise the historic association of the Isbel family with the Beulah district and their contribution to the local community. All submissions must be received by **[31st November 2025 – not less than 30 days from this notice]**.


Additional Information:
