MURTOA: Situated in the warm heart of the Wimmera, with the nearby Grampians National Park as a stunning backdrop, possesses some unique local experiences. Murtoa is Aboriginal for "Home of the Lizard", and features large lizard sculptures in the town centre. Murtoa was first settled in 1872.



The town of Murtoa is built around Lake Marma, widely recognised as one of the State's most picturesque, and boasts the largest inland grain receival centre in Victoria. Murtoa is home to a number of important local industries and the only National Heritage Listing in the Wimmera – The Stick Shed. Other Heritage Listed attractions are the Water Tower Museum and Kurrajong Avenue in Comyn Street. Murtoa also offers a comprehensive range of services, retail outlets and sporting facilities.

H • The Stick Shed is National Heritage listed and takes its name from the 560 Mountain Ash unmilled poles or 'sticks' up to 19m high that support the mammoth 270m x 60m structure built as a wartime emergency grain storage. The Stick Shed has undergone extensive restoration and is open daily for viewing 10am-3pm. Station is open for viewing Monday to Saturday 12-2pm and Sunday 12-2 pm, and by appointment: 0429 944 673 or 0437 920 734. The Water Tower Museum houses a range of local artefacts including the famous James Hill Taxidermy Collection of over 500 birds and other fauna. Concordia Cottage is the last remaining section of the original Lutheran Concordia College established in Murtoa in the 1890's and features related material. Visit the recently rejuvenated 1878 Railway Station that holds railway history displays, opposite the 1895 Railway Hotel.

- Dunmunkle Sumpoilers Engines Museum is located at the former Wimmera Inland Freezing Works site opposite The Stick Shed. Included in the impressive museum are four massive single piston Richard-Hornsby engines dating back to 1910 which are believed to be the only set of four remaining on their original footings in the world.
- Lake Marma & Rabl Park provide a tranquil oasis in the centre of town. A 2km walking track around Lake Marma features many varied scenes with abundant wildlife, ideal picnic spots with treed surrounds, electric BBQ's, children's playgrounds, fishing, skate park and historic features.

- Murtoa's BIG Weekend three day annual festival occurs the first weekend in October. It features the local Show, Murtoa Cup races, Dunmunkle Sumpoilers Engines, Monster Market, Stick Shed, Water Tower Museum and other unique entertainment each year.

- Murtoa Memorial Gates were erected in 1921 to remember soldiers from the district who have served their country. It is a rare example of its type in Victoria and forms a picturesque frame to the Lake Marma Recreation Reserve.
- Murtoa Cemetery is 3km east of town and provides an insight into the early beginnings of Wimmera settlement, particularly its local German heritage.
- Barrabool Reserve, a few km South of Murtoa, has much Aboriginal Heritage and is a largely un-disturbed area of Wimmera flora and fauna. Dry weather only.














